Squad Size	Squad size: 7 including GK
Ball Size	Nike – Size 4 (Grade 5s & 6s Nike – Size 3 (Grade 3s & 4s
Goal Size	5m x 2m Goals
Pitch Size	40m x 30m
2 X 12.5 Minute Halves	Minimum 2-minute half-time break
Goalkeeper Disposals	The goalkeeper is allowed to handle the ball anywhere in the penalty area. The goalkeeper is not allowed to kick or drop kick the ball directly from their hands. The ball is in play once it moves out of the penalty area. After saving or gathering the ball, Goalkeepers must dispose of the ball within 6 secs by: - Rolling or throwing - Placing on the ground and kicking - No footy kicks or drop kicks
Back Passes to Goalkeeper	A player cannot pass the ball back to the GK and they pick it up with their hands
Throw Ins	Player faces the field of play, has part of each foot on the ground either on or behind the touch line, uses both hands and delivers the ball from behind and over his or her head. The thrower must not touch the ball again until it has touched another player. Opponents must be at least 3 metres away from the ball until it is in
	play. The ball is in play once it enters the field of play. A goal cannot be scored directly from a throw in.
No Offsisde	Game Leaders should strongly discourage children from permanently standing in blatant offside positions. Children should be made aware of the official offside rule during training and be encouraged to adopt this philosophy during the game at all times.

Goal Kicks	A goal kick is awarded to the defending team when it crosses the goal line after touching the attacking team last.
	Ball must be kicked from the ground from anywhere inside the box. Ball must be stationary when it is kicked. Ball can be kicked by any player on the defending team.
	Attacking team must stay 5m back from the front of the box until the ball is outside the box.
Corners	Ball crossing the goal line after touching the defending team last: A player from the attacking team places the ball inside the corner arc nearest to the point where the ball crossed the line. Opponents must be at least 5m away from the ball until it is in play. The ball is in play when it is kicked and moves. A goal may be scored directly from a corner kick.
Fouls and Misconduct	Indirect free kicks are awarded for all acts of handball or fouls and misconduct. Opponents must be at least 5 metres away from the ball when the indirect free kick is taken. An indirect free kick is where a goal can be scored only if the ball subsequently touches another player before it enters the goal.
	For deliberate or serious acts of handball or fouls and misconduct in the penalty area, a penalty kick is awarded from an 6-metre penalty mark with only a goalkeeper in position.
	All other players must be outside the penalty area and be at least 5 metres behind the penalty mark.
	Fouls and misconduct are:
	 Kicks or attempts to kick an opponent;
	Trips or attempts to trip an opponent;
	Jumps at an opponent;
	Charges at an opponent;
	Strikes or attempts to strike an opponent;
	Pushes an opponent;
	Tackles an opponent from behind to gain possession of the ball;
	Makes contact with the opponent before touching the ball;
	Holds an opponent;
	Handles the ball deliberately;
	 Plays in a dangerous manner; and
	Impedes the progress of a player.
Substitutions	Substitutions Players may be rotated on and off the field at any time during the game. Game Leader may make substitutions while the ball is in play, ensuring the player is off the field before the substitute goes on.

Points and Scoring	Teams will be awarded the following points based on performance: 3 points – for a win 1 point – for a draw 0 points – for a loss
Cup and Plate	Boys - At the end of the games played in your group the top 3 in Group A and B will go into the cup play off. The 4 th in-group A will also go into the Cup Play off. Out of the remaining 3 teams the best will join in the cup play off quarterfinals. The last two teams in both groups will go into a friendly. The plate play off will be the losers of the quarterfinals The Cup will have a Quarter Final, Semi Final and a Final. The Plate will have a Semi Final and a Final.
	Girls – The girls will have 1 group only. The top 4 will go into the semi finals and the bottom 2 will play a friendly. The winner will go into the Cup final. There will be no plate play off.
